Paraclete

Faith: the question of assurance

"I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God so that you may know that you have eternal life" (1 John 5:13 NIV)

Anyone who denies that a believer can have assurance of salvation will have a difficult time getting around this text. Over against the incipient Gnosticism which held that knowledge was far superior to simple faith, John insists that those who have faith in Christ also have knowledge - the knowledge that they have eternal life. Not just an elite group among believers, not just those who have received some special revelation, but all true believers may and should know that they have eternal life. Even Peter who says, "Therefore, my brothers, be all the more eager to make your calling and election sure (2 Peter 1:10)," urging us to strengthen our assurance that we have been effectually called and chosen by God to salvation. Assurance of salvation must therefore be both possible and desirable. Paul in Romans 8:16 advises. "The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God's children." The words 'testifies with' are in the present tense, indicating that this is a continuing witness. The testimony of the Spirit here described is a joint witness with that of our own spirit. The Holy Spirit, in other words, confirms the witness of our own spirit that we are children of God - that testimony by the Holy Spirit is a lifelong continuous action which works through various types of experiences and trials.

An explanation from the Registrar:

TBI offers classes to accommodate our students. These classes fall into four categories:

In-Class Courses – Classes are taught 2 ½ to 3 hours per class, one day a week by a TBI professor.

<u>Self-paced Survey Courses</u> – They are courses which are self-taught by the student, while following TBI instructors guidelines. These classes may meet every other week or have optional attendance requirements. However, in all cases, a mandatory introductory and closing class is required.

Independent Study Courses or
Independent Research Courses – In these courses
the student is assigned research questions or a
subject or subjects to gain knowledge of a
particular book of the Bible, a theological subject
or a particular area of study. A minimum of
classroom attendance is required, but is
determined by each individual instructor. There
are also strict time restraints in completing these
courses.
